The College received the certificate of NAAC in the year 2005, hence the college is working on the modalities of having a fully functional IQAC and it is expected to be formed by the end of the session. However, the College through its Governing body has taken some important decisions relating to the enhancement of the academic and non academic life in the college campus. The College has been granted a status of “A College with Potential for Excellence” , hence the College plans to bring out a massive change in the academic scenario of the College through IT Reforms in the mode of education and administrative performances. The College also plans to start preparation for starting PG classes and turning the College into a Research Centre.

E.C.C has been granted C.P.E (College with Potential for Excellence) status by the UGC on April 7, 2006. It has been selected under the C.P.E scheme as one of 50 colleges from all over India to receive a special grant upto Rs. 1 Crore to help it reach world class standard in academics and research. A total of 5 colleges including E.C.C have been selected from U.P. It is the only associated college of University of Allahabad qualifying for the scheme after meeting up to the 48 parameters of evaluation as per the guidelines prepared by the standing committee on C.P.E. Now there are questions that are to be addressed urgently for creation of an egalitarian society.
